


The sign says it all, "A Miracle Zone".

We trust you are healthy and safe where you are and still enjoying the many blessings from the Lord each new day, even though some of you may be going through a very difficult time. Rest assured that God is with you as you put your trust in Him. He will carry you through it all. A number of you have requested prayer from us which we have done diligently, and still do in many cases, and it is wonderful to hear how the Lord has answered many of our prayers. God is good and faithful.

While it seems that some parts of the world are sort of managing the Covid virus usually through stringent lock downs and aggressive vaccinations programs (yet not always), other parts of the world less aggressive with its handling and management, are overwhelmed with fresh outbreaks and new strains, which is causing an enormous crisis in various communities causing untold suffering through loss of life and decimating their economies. For them there just doesn't seem to be an end in sight.



I think the world is going through Covid fatigue now in a big way as various peoples are becoming more and more restless, frustrated, angered at new policies, angered at the unknown, disruptions, border closures, just to name a few, which is causing a lot of anxiety, anger and stress amongst many people. Of course there is no immediate resolve and people are just going to have to live with it for a while longer. Here in our village we have been and still are, Covid free, which is a real miracle as the virus



has been slowly creeping up into our region in the year gone by and is now rapidly spreading in our surrounding areas. The government even recently closed our only road in the region to try and stop the spread of the virus. Only food supplies and goods are allowed to use the road with covid tests carried out for the truck drivers at various check points. Our village is in semi-lock down now again with a number of restrictions in place such as limiting people coming in and going out

from our village as well as temperature checks, washing hands etc. We want to make sure that this virus doesn't make its way into our village as that would be detrimental particularly to those who are sick here.

Many nations place their confidence in their military strength, strong defenses, and economic stability. But because of their people's inner moral decay, their apparent source of strength becomes inadequate. There is a tendency in many nations toward removing all traces of God from daily life. But if a nation forgets its Maker, its strengths may prove worthless when put to the test.



Our Okto arrived in our village on the 5th June last year, 2020. He was a very messed up little boy when he arrived. While his mother was pregnant with Okto his parents divorced. His mother became mentally unstable which resulted in him staying with his grandmother. He became very ill which was noticeable to others in the village. A relative decided to bring him to a small town, which is not too far from Living Waters Village, in the hope that he would get treatment but he ended up staying with people who thought perhaps they were doing the right thing but messed him up quite a bit. Via someone he ended up here with us, hoping to get some treatment. There is a lot more to this story but it is rather sensitive. We noticed his ailing condition and sought medical treatment. We discovered that he had advanced tuberculosis and had 3 tumors, 2 rather large (one of great concern) and one already protruding through his lung and skin which was also of great concern due to the risk of infection. However through lots of prayers from everyone here in our village and many of you, plus tuberculosis medication he is now completely healed and he looks and feels great. God obviously has a great plan for his life. We are so blessed and honored to have him here with us.

Thank you all for your prayers and support for our Okto and children like him who were found or brought here. They live here now in a safe environment, are loved and

cared for, receiving a wonderful opportunity to reach their full potential through our education system, and learn to walk with Jesus every day. It is so fantastic to see how happy they are and enjoying their lives now with so many others who come from similar backgrounds. As they grow up here, they too, develop a loving, caring attitude for each other and become very passionate to help their tribal people find happiness in life through finding Christ. They all have experienced living under the control and power of witchdoctors who lord it over the people through demonic activities causing intense fear, anger, violence, hatred, murder, nil respect for women etc, preventing anyone to have a happy life. But praise God, that is changing now as children here are praying for their families and tribes, to be set free from being under the spell of witchdoctors because their families now hear the Word of God preached to them through our people who go and preach the Good News there and as a result the Holy Spirit helps them to open their hearts so that they can believe and receive Christ in their lives. What a privilege to be part of God's plan.





Many of our children and teenagers recently contracted chickenpox which spread like wildfire amongst them all, particularly amongst the children and teenagers who arrived last year. Some received a mild dose and others a more severe dose. Some only got a few spots and others were covered. The teenagers in general were more covered with spots and had prolonged high fevers. It took about one month for the spread of chickenpox to subdue. We were very grateful that this year's outbreak of chickenpox didn't beat the record of a number of years ago when we had 58 children and youth at the same time with chickenpox. What a challenge that was which kept us on our feet day and night.




Our Amelia.

Her parents had died from HIV and since then she ended up being tossed from one place to another as no one wanted her. She ended up looking after herself most of the time yet she was only 4 years old then. Word got to us here in our village that there was this little girl who was mostly on her own and if we wanted her. Of course we did and organized someone to pick her up and welcomed her here into our big family. After a medical examination we found out that she too has HIV. She is now under treatment and doing very well. She enjoys going to school and living with lots of brothers and sisters. Every 6 months we have to take her to Pontianak to monitor her condition. Please pray with us for the Lord to do a wonderful miracle of healing in her life. We are so grateful that Jesus brought her here as He loves her deeply and wants the very best for her as He so desires for all of us.

Our Yolanda is doing well with the peritoneal dialysis which she has to do 4 times a day. She has been doing this now already for a few years and it works out so much better for her as she has more freedom and independence. 

Pak Picin is the father of two of our girls that live here, our Eka and Nopa. Early this year Eka approached us letting us know that her father was deathly sick in their village and there was no one who cared for him as their mother had already passed away a number of years ago. Other

family members did at one stage take him to the nearest hospital but because they had to pay for it and had no money they decided to take him home and let him look after himself. Hence he was rather neglected and forgotten.

Someone from their village let the girls know that their father was dying. He couldn't walk, sit, control his bowels anymore nor eat anymore. We decided to pick him up and take him to a private hospital in Pontianak. Our Ana & Bobby together with Eka transported pak Picin to the hospital but when the emergency department had one look at him said he wasn't welcome there and told them to go away. Unbelievable but that's how it goes here at times.



4 months later. God is so good.

They took him to another private hospital and there the emergency department were shocked to see this man in such a state. Although he required urgent

attention they fumbled around for many hours but for them it was a way of saying that his case was really a lost cause because any treatment was going to be expensive and they didn't think that our guys had that sort of money. Again unbelievable. Ana had to speak sternly to the hospital staff requesting to have all the tests done necessary which they eventually got around to and discovered that he was a diabetic. Once they had the insulin under control and attended to his other needs he started to improve rapidly but was still in grave danger. Weeks went by in the hospital and after a number of operations, the hospital bills sky-rocketed to incredible amounts. We decided to bring him home to our village and treat him further in our clinic which was really such a blessing in disguise. Due to his previous diabetic neglect a lot of his skin was already dead or dying

which the hospital removed as you can see on the photo. They wanted to do skin grafts but I so believed that the Lord could heal his skin as I have seen Him to do that before with some of our children. Our medical staff here in our village looked after him night and day, put honey and special dressings on his exposed wounds and prayed with him regularly and so did all our people here in our village. After 4 months his back wound has grown new skin as you can see on the photo. He walks again, enjoys a good diet and feels and looks great. What a journey, but we praise and thank God for His intervention in the life of this soul. Our prayer is that pak Picin will come to know His Savior, Jesus Christ, intimately and will share his testimony with many villagers how this wonderful compassionate God rescued him and gave him a new life, physically and spiritually.

The spiritual ground there is hard as a rock due to the occult. A lot of witchcraft is done in that region more so than in other areas hence their area is super difficult but not impossible with God. He sent them there and they too have been tested time and time again but are staying put knowing that the Lord is with them. Many people are coming to Christ there too, burning all their witchdoctor paraphernalia as they renounce their allegiance to the occult world. How awesome to see people surrender their lives to Christ and hunger for the things of God.

Our Kristian Arden & Sinurwati are also ministering upstream on the Melawi river but in the remotest region of all the church planters. Although the government has planted an outpost there the region is still very wild and primitive. Kristian Arden is overseeing a number of church plants in that region and as a result seeing a number of Uud Danum tribal people coming to the Lord which is awesome. It is a harsh, hard, wild place where at times the occult seems to have the upper hand, but God is at work there and performing miracles amongst the people, intervening in their occult practices and showing them what forgiveness of sin is and unconditional love, a life of happiness instead of a life of bondage and fear.

Please do pray with us for all our church planters who are doing an amazing job against all odds where they are. There is only one road to their places which is the river, a dangerous, and unpredictable flow of water which constantly changes throughout the day as water levels fall and rise quickly at each rainfall either exposing tree trunks and sharp boulders sticking out of the water or combatting floating fallen trees due to raging flood waters. Sometimes they have electricity in their village but often they don't. Some places have a phone signal and many none at all. Many places have malaria, typhoid, hepatitis, tuberculosis, HIV and the likes but little or no medical facilities at all. The nearest hospital is for some a full days travel away and others two to three days costing them one – two months wages one way. Yet despite all these hardships, discomforts

and lack of basic amenities our families still remain faithful serving Him in those isolated parts of the world. Hence our prayers are vital. Building Progress:

Within the three months that have just passed a lot of building activity has been accomplished. We are trying to urgently complete a number of children's homes so that we can move a lot of children from the training center area so that new children can move into the training center facility. Titus house is almost finished. Perhaps another 2 weeks of finishing touches and then 25 children and youth can move into this fantastic house. Ezra house and Nehemiah house still need another 6 weeks before we can move anyone in there and David house and Jonathan house need a bit longer than that, but we are getting there. It's been a huge job particularly because these homes are being built while many other infrastructure projects are being built at the same time.

Jonah house is extensively being renovated and turned into a children's home as well. Progress is going well and once finished it will be able to house 20 children and youth with house parents.

The primary school undercover area is a massive job for us but it's coming along wonderfully as you can see on the photo. Trusses and roof sheets are in place and now we are focusing on getting the

ceilings and lighting done. Gutters are on hold as they are still in Kuching. Please continue to pray with us that trucks filled with building materials will continue to miraculously arrive. Extra classrooms will be built between some of the current buildings to give us more room. The old rusted fencing around the school property has been removed making way for an entire new non-rust, non-paint fencing. A very important structure as the school is on a hill with steep slopes and valleys all around it. It would be rather dangerous without fencing. We are still looking at least 6 months before this project is finished.

More roads and road gutters have been completed which is a massive task on our very hilly property but awesome to see the progress. Yet still a long way to go.

The Jair house, built for 12 couples or families is finally completed and already almost full. This building is opposite to the training center where these couples help out with the running of the training center. Eventually some of these couples will become house parents.

Our church building opposite the training center is also undergoing some changes. The building is already too small for our services. We decided to take out one wall so that the outside undercover area becomes one with the church hall. The wall will be replaced with a wall of sliding doors which can be opened when more room is required. This will solve our immediate space shortage problem.

Because we hear the Bible so often, we can become dulled to its words and immune to its teachings. Instead, we should listen carefully to every verse and ask the Holy Spirit to help us answer the question, How does this apply to my life?



As believers, we should take advantage of the opportunities we have and do what we can for Christ instead of worrying about what we cannot do.

Our Home in Nanga Pinoh:

Already for a couple of years we have been trying to sell our house in Nanga Pinoh, a small town about 17km from our village. We built the house about 16 years ago for our high school students. Because we didn't have a high school yet in our village we had to transport our youth to that town but because each day it took 2-3 hours, one way, to get there due to the road being so bad we decided to rent a house at first but after a while we realized it was totally inadequate for the amount of youth we had and it was overrun with rats that were chewing the fingertips of our youth during the night when they were asleep. When we found out we knew we had to build something fast. We didn't have any money to build anything but God made a way where there seemed to be no way. The house was built with a frame of iron wood, cement walls and steel roof sheets and for many years the house has been such a blessing for so

many youth that came through their high school years until we opened up our own high school on our property. Hence we had no more use for it so thought best to sell it. However, of course we prayed about it a lot and didn't get a real go ahead to sell it but also no clear indication what the Lord wanted us to do with it. But because of the financial crisis and the Corona virus, real estate came to a halt, hence there were no buyers. In the meantime we had to have some of our guys live there for security and the house had to be maintained and looked after which kept costing us money.

Last December while visiting and ministering in some of our remote villages, the Lord showed me that there was a great need to look after families who came to Nanga Pinoh with family members needing hospitalization yet had nowhere to stay. It already cost them one to two month's wages on travel costs to get to the hospital and then had to find accommodation in a cheap hotel which was still too expensive for them. Sometimes they had to stay for weeks at a time. All of a sudden it dawned on me that we had such a facility to help people in such need. After more prayer we believed this is what the Lord wants us to do hence we made a start to renovate the house, to make it suitable for such a ministry BUT after a thorough look at the condition of the house we came to discover that much of the framework was eaten away by white ants (as you can see on the photo) and only just standing up because of some other materials that covered the frames. A bit of a shock to say the least. As a result we had to demolish the entire house and start from scratch. Am I glad we didn't sell the house. That would have been devastating for the new owner. While I am writing this we have started digging out the foundations for the new building. It's going to be a huge job, on top of all the other projects that we have going in our village but a start has been made and no doubt eventually it will be finished and ready to help many families in need.
